

Threshold Recovery

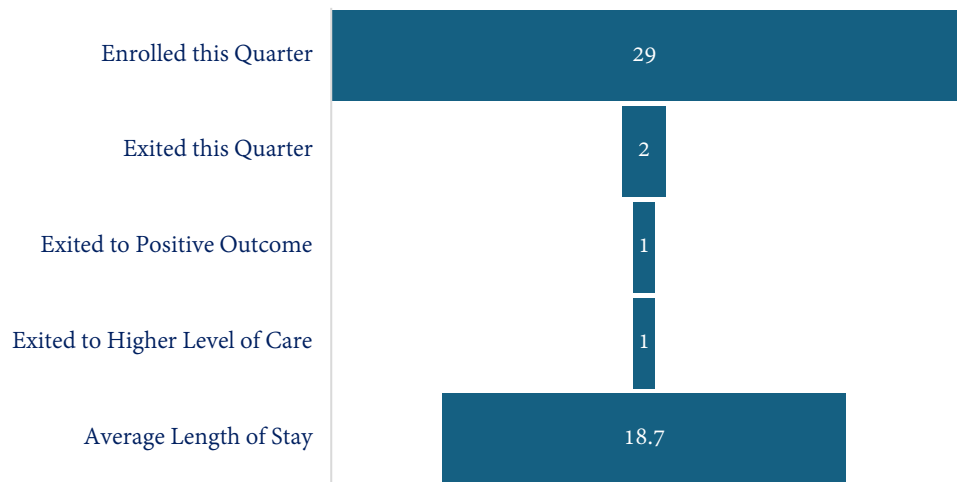
Mid-Year

Threshold Recovery served 29 men since beginning operation in Q2.

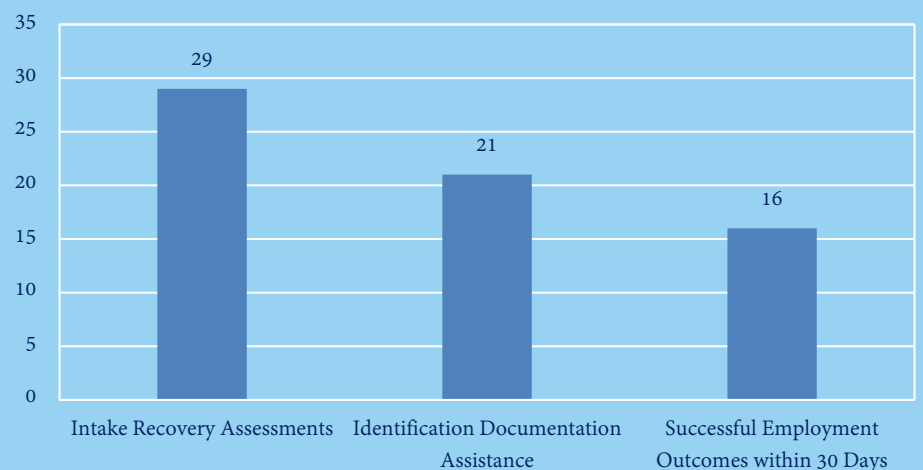
All clients were experiencing a period of homelessness prior to enrolling in the program.

Housing Details

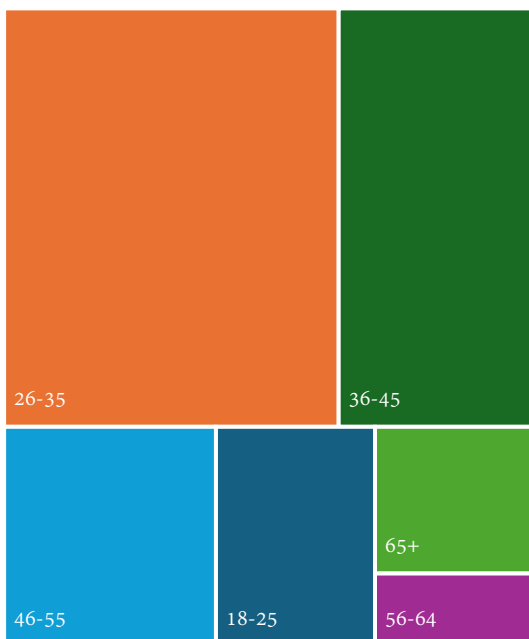


Case Management and Assistance

Age Range of Men

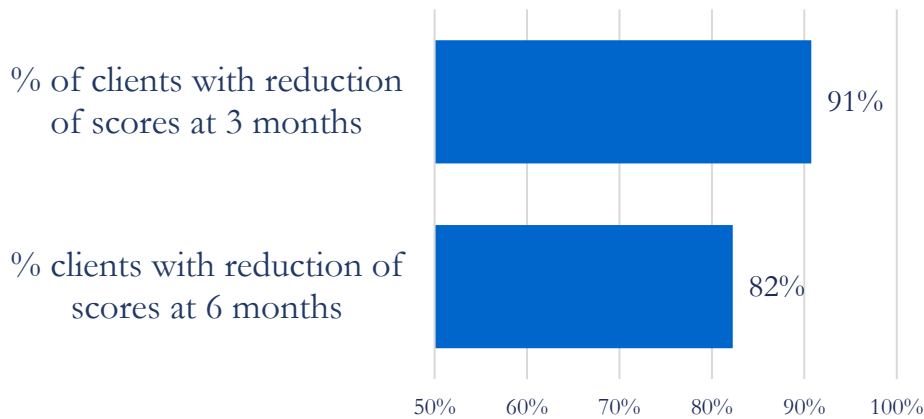


18 clients received referrals to meet a variety of needs. 40% of all referrals were for mental health assessments or treatment. 8.5% were referrals to Outpatient and Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOP) services.

All 18 referrals had successful follow-ups.

Doors of Hope

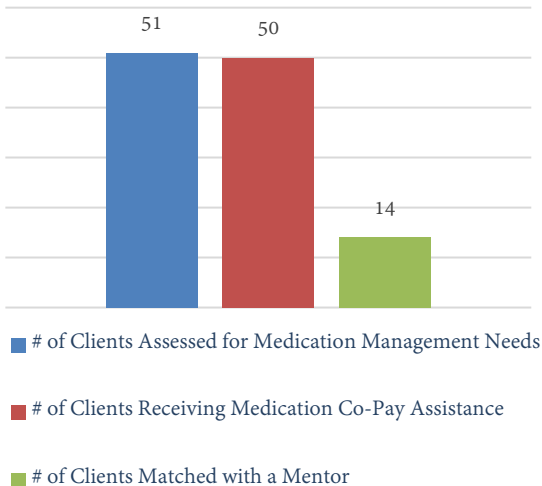
Trauma Symptoms Improvements



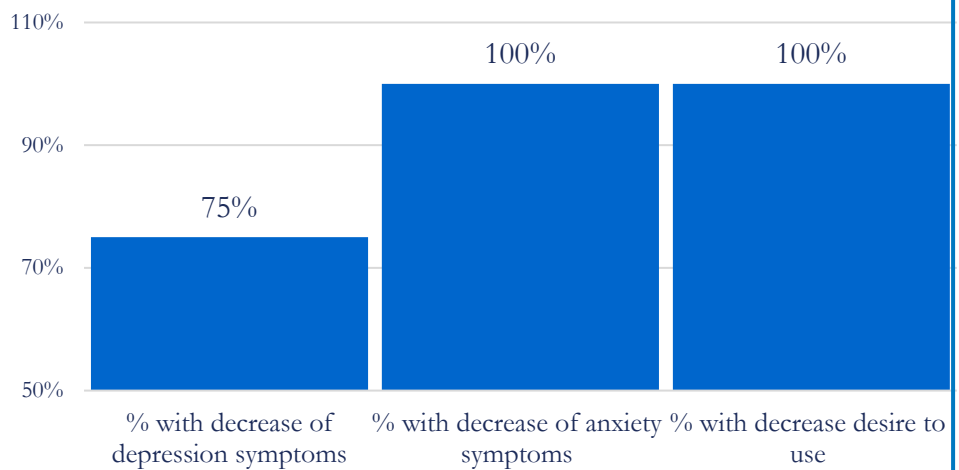
Stable employment is vital to **long-term recovery** for women impacted by SUD/OUD. It is also an important factor in **reducing recidivism** risk for individuals re-entering the community from incarceration.

84% of participants achieve employment **within 90 days** of enrolling in the program.
